AFFIDAVIT OF ANTHONY CAPORALE

Before me, the undersigned authority, personally appeared Anthony Caporale, who after being sworn, deposes and says as follows:

1. My name is Anthony Caporale. I am over 18 years of age and in all other respects competent to testify. My statements are based on personal knowledge.
2. I am a resident of DeSoto County, Florida.
3. I am a member of the United States Association of Reptile Keepers, Florida Chapter.
4. I am the owner of 3D Rocks & Supplies, Inc. Through that business I breed and sell reticulated pythons, dwarf reticulated pythons, Burmese pythons, ball pythons, and boa constrictors. Some of these animals are incredibly rare. For instance, we have a specific morph of dwarf reticulated pythons—which are much smaller than reticulated pythons—of which there are

probably less than 20 found within the United States.

5. My wife and I came to Florida a little more than a year ago from Illinois with our family to start our reptile breeding business. We invested hundreds of thousands of dollars to get our business going in Florida. We have operated this business in Florida for a little more than eight months.

6. In September 2019, my wife Renee Caporale obtained an appropriate permit from the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (“Commission”) in order to sell Conditional Species, specifically Burmese pythons and reticulated pythons. I am an authorized person under that permit. That permit is still in good standing and is not scheduled to expire until September 10, 2020.

7. My wife and I have invested thousands of dollars to comply with the program, including with respect to inspections, disaster planning, and caging. In order to comply with the program, we have had to essentially meet the facility requirements applicable to zoos.

8. Although we have only just begun this business within the last year, we expected to earn significant revenues, particularly given our ability to breed dwarf reticulated pythons, which are very rare and retail for \$2,000.00 to \$200,000.00 each.

9. We own approximately 15 reptiles that are subject to the Commission’s Conditional Species program. We have had several of these animals for many years, and they are incredibly valuable, not only for breeding and selling but also for their value as pets. Some of our pythons are more than ten years old. Building a reticulated python population requires substantial investment and dedication working with the animals. One cannot put a value on these animals. We also have prior agreements and contracts dependent upon the ability to sell baby Burmese pythons and reticulated pythons.

10. Consequently, I am substantially affected and will suffer irreparable harm should the amendment of section 379.372, Florida Statutes (“section 379.372” or “the statute”), and Executive Order No. 20-19 (“Executive Order”) be enforced. Given the effective date of the statute and Executive Order, this harm is immediate and ongoing. Under the statute and Executive Order, we are required to end our business, which is focused almost entirely on breeding and selling reticulated pythons and Burmese pythons. We have already lost sales as a consequence of the statute and Executive Order, and we are currently operating under the assumption that we will soon be forced to part with these snakes. I am also concerned that the Commission will be unable to help relocate these animals and these snakes face the risk of being euthanized if proper homes are not found.

11. I also use these snakes, including my dwarf reticulated pythons, for educational and emotional support services, particularly with at-risk children. Snakes make great emotional support animals, particularly because they are hypoallergenic. We do educational demonstrations at various reptile shows to teach others about these species. We also do traveling educational shows in private settings to showcase different reptiles and teach others about them.

12. Under the Executive Order, I will be unable to continue this educational work. Although the statute as amended authorizes a person to continue possession of Burmese and reticulated pythons for educational purposes, the Executive Order states that in order to do so, a facility will need to meet the requirements for the possession of a “Prohibited Species” as described in Florida Administrative Code Rule 68-5.007.

13. Under that rule, exhibition of prohibited species may only be conducted by public aquaria, zoological parks, or public exhibitors. My wife and I would not qualify as any of these, and would be ineligible to obtain such a permit, because we do not have a permanent, fixed location

where the general public is able to view our snakes during regularly scheduled business hours.

14. My wife and I do not qualify for any other exemption from the changes made by SB 1414 and the Executive Order as we do not sell or breed green iguanas or tegu lizards.

15. From my perspective, the Conditional Species program has worked very well, and I am aware of no reason why it should come to an end.

16. Additionally, I am unaware of any threatened environmental harm associated with continuing the Conditional Species program, particularly with respect to authorizing continued commercial use of reticulated and Burmese pythons. Notably too, all sales we conduct of Conditional Species are already conducted outside of Florida. To my knowledge there are no records of any incidents where permitholders have lost one of their Conditional Species in the wild or have had one escape.

17. I did not anticipate these changes in law occurring. I upended the lives of my family to move to Florida in order to pursue our reptile business. The Conditional Species program has been in place for more than a decade, and I expected that it would continue. Enforcement of the statute and Executive Order means the end of a large portion of our business and the destruction of our investments and will require giving up reticulated and Burmese pythons, many of which my wife and I have raised to maturity over the last several years and are invaluable.

This effort will improve clarity and conciseness and aid in addressing emerging invasive species issues.

DEPARTMENT OF LEGAL AFFAIRS

2-37.010 Attorney Services

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The proposed substantial rewording of the rule is intended to merge all the rules regarding private attorney services into one rule and to clarify the requirements. The remaining rules in this chapter are being repealed.

SUMMARY: The proposed substantial rewording of the rule merges all the rules regarding private attorney services into a single rule and clarifies the rule requirements.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: this rule change will not have any impact on licensees and their businesses or the businesses that employ them. The rule will not increase any fees, business costs, personnel costs, will not decrease profit opportunities, and will not require any specialized knowledge to comply. This change will not increase any direct or indirect regulatory costs. Hence, a Statement of Estimated Regulatory Costs (SERC) is not necessary and the rule will not require ratification by the Legislature.

Any person who wishes to provide information regarding a statement of estimated regulatory costs, or provide a proposal for a lower cost regulatory alternative must do so in writing within 21 days of this notice.

(A SUBSTANTIAL REWORDING OF RULE 2-37.010, F.A.C. SEE FLORIDA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE FOR PRESENT TEXT).

2-37.010 Private Attorney Services.

(1) The following forms shall be used by agencies when requesting approval to contract for private attorney services pursuant to Section 287.059, F.S.:

(a) The Department of Legal Affairs adopts a form to be completed by agencies who wish to obtain approval to contract for private attorney services. Form OAG-001 (5/20), entitled "Request for Attorney General Approval of Private Attorney Services," is hereby incorporated by reference and available from <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-or-at-the-Other-Resources> link at <http://www.myfloridalegal.com/aglink>.

(b) All contracts for private attorney services shall contain a completed addendum entitled "Office of the Attorney General Attachment A for Private Attorney Services," Form OAG-002, (5/20), which is hereby incorporated by reference and available from <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-or-at-the-Other-Resources> link at <http://www.myfloridalegal.com/aglink>.

(c) Completed forms shall be submitted to oag.civil.eserve@myfloridalegal.com.

(2) The standard fee schedule to be utilized by agencies is as follows:

(a) Specialized attorney services are limited to admiralty, copyright, patent, trademark, international communications, media, bond and securities law, (including litigation and other services normally performed by such counsel) and may be billed up to \$250.00 per billable hour.

(b) All other attorney services may be billed up to \$200.00 per billable hour.

(c) All paralegal, legal assistant, law clerk and research assistant services may be billed up to \$40.00 per billable hour.

(d) The term "billable hour" means the actual time spent providing attorney services to the agency measured in 6 to 10 minute intervals. Costs for such items as exhibits, transcripts, and witness fees are not considered a part of the billable hour. They will be reimbursed based upon documented third party

vendor charges to the contract attorney, provided prior authorization is given by the agency. Expenses incurred for travel shall be limited to terms and rates established in Section 112.061, F.S. Office overhead shall include routine office expenses such as local phone calls, routine postage, copy work, local travel expenses, printed library materials and courier, word processing, clerical or secretarial services, and shall be included in the billable hour and not separately compensated. Non-routine office overhead shall include expenses such as long distance phone calls, facsimile transmissions, bulk mailings, bulk third party copying and computer-assisted legal research services and will be reimbursed based upon documented third party vendor charges provided they are justified to the agency. There shall be no payment for firm surcharges added to third party vendor charges. Exceptional non-routine office overhead expenses must be defined on a case-by-case basis in the contractual agreement and must be approved by the agency before being incurred.

(e) Alternate billing methodologies, such as value billing, i.e., flat fee for services or fee by deliverable; contingency fee or billing on the basis of a percentage of the amount involved may be used in lieu of hourly rates when it is deemed the most cost-effective or appropriate billing methodology.

1. Contingency fees may be negotiated not to exceed 35 percent through trial and not to exceed 40 percent through appeal, where attorney services involve litigation, except collections litigation shall not exceed 30 percent.

2. Where contingency fees involve non-litigation attorney services, the fee shall not exceed the rate in the market in which the attorney service is being provided.

3. Flat fees and other billing methodologies shall not exceed the rate in the market in which the attorney service is being provided.

4. The term “rate in the market” as used in subsection (2)(c)2. and 3., means the geographic location and the legal specialization in which the attorney service is being provided.

(f) At the beginning of each professional relationship with an agency, a contract attorney or firm shall provide a schedule of current billing rates for partners and associates.

(3) Standard Fee Schedule Exceptions. Agencies wishing to exceed the standard fee schedule for attorney services set forth in subsection (2), must demonstrate necessity and obtain prior approval by completing and submitting Form OAG-003 (5/20), entitled “Statement of Waiver,” which is hereby incorporated by reference and available from <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-> or at the “Other Resources” link at <http://www.myfloridalegal.com/aglink>, to the Department of Legal Affairs. The Statement of Waiver must provide a detailed analysis justifying the need to exceed the standard fee schedule that addresses one or more of the following criteria:

(a) The inability of the agency to obtain adequate legal representation within the confines of the standard fee schedule. In such instances the agency must set forth in detail the efforts at procurement which the agency engaged in prior to determining that the standard fee schedule would not provide adequate attorney services.

(b) The agency is unable to obtain attorney services with the special expertise necessary to perform the particular legal function which the agency requires within the fee schedule. In such instances the agency must set forth in detail the reasons why special expertise is necessary, the analysis which led it to that conclusion, and why the agency was unable to find such expertise at a price within the standard fee schedule.

(c) The waiver is necessary in order to provide attorney services as a result of an emergency, an immediate danger to the public health, safety and welfare, or an opportunity for the state to preserve or enhance fiscal resources and that failure to contract immediately for attorney services in excess of the standard fee schedule will work to the detriment of the state. In such instances the agency must set forth in detail the emergency, danger or opportunity in question, efforts made at procuring attorney services within the standard fee schedule, the reasons why such efforts failed, or a justification why the emergency, danger or opportunity in question requires immediate contracting for attorney services in excess of the standard fee schedule.

(4) Failure to comply with any of the provisions of Section 287.059, F.S. or this rule shall constitute grounds for denial of an agency’s request to contract for private attorney services. The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: this rule change will not have any impact on licensees and their businesses or the businesses that employ them. RULE TITLE: Use of Live Streaming Technology for Delivery of Approved In-Person Education Courses

SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE: The Florida Real Estate Commission (“FREC”) is statutorily mandated to require specified Prelicensure, Post-Licensure, School Instructor and Continuing Education (“CE”) courses as prerequisites to initial licensure, licensure renewal, and licensure reactivation of Real Estate Sales Agents, Real Estate Brokers, and Real Estate School Instructors. Pursuant to this authority, the FREC has promulgated rules setting forth the requirements for approval of Prelicensure, Post-Licensure, Reactivation, and CE courses. The rules establish different minimum criteria for in-person vs. online or distance learning courses; and courses are submitted by providers and approved/authorized by the FREC as either in-person or online/distance. If a course is approved as in-person, it cannot be offered via online or distance learning methods, unless it is also approved as an online/distance learning course.

On March 1, 2020, Florida Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order Number 20-51 which directed the State Health Officer and Surgeon General, Dr. Scott Rivkees, to declare a public health emergency pursuant to the spread of the Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). On March 9, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order Number 20-52 (Emergency Management - COVID-19 Public Health Emergency) and officially declared that a state of emergency exists in the State of Florida. COVID-19 disease is a severe acute respiratory illness that can spread among humans through

respiratory transmission and presents with symptoms similar to those of influenza. As of June 18, 2020, there are over 93,500 confirmed cases of COVID-19 disease in the State of Florida. The Center for Disease Control (“CDC”) recommends mitigation measures to combat the spread of COVID-19 disease such as staying home when sick, keeping away from others who are sick, staying home when a household member is sick with respiratory disease symptoms, and for those who are at higher risk, including older adults and those who have serious chronic medical conditions, to avoid non-essential travel and to avoid crowds as much as possible. Even though mitigation measures have been successful in “slowing the spread,” the risk of public infection remains high.

Since the issuance of the Executive Orders and declaration of a public health emergency by the State Health Officer and Surgeon General Dr. Rivkees, the FREC determined that live video streaming/videoconferencing technologies, such as Zoom®, GoToMeeting®, Microsoft Teams®, or WebEx®, among others, could be used as an alternative method of delivery of the course, and which would satisfy the purpose and intent of the FREC’s approval of in-person courses without exposure to the dangers of being in large groups of people, necessity of travel itself, potential contribution to the spread of the virus, and most importantly, would ensure compliance with the State Health Officer’s Orders, CDC Recommendations, and Governor DeSantis’s Emergency Orders, including the Governor’s “Safe. Smart. Step-by-Step.” recovery plan.

Florida’s Real Estate Professionals, and those who come in contact with them, should not be unnecessarily put at risk during this healthcare emergency. Accordingly, the FREC, by emergency rule, will waive the requirement that those educational courses previously approved by the FREC as live or in-person must in fact be presented “in-person,” and authorizes any such course previously approved to be delivered by live-streaming/videoconferencing technologies, that allow the instructor or monitor to observe each student. The Board finds that this action is a measured regulatory approach that helps to mitigate the threat of exposure to COVID-19 disease to Floridians, including Real Estate professionals and those that come in contact with them, while still satisfying the purpose and intent of the waived requirements.

REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: Given the recently declared emergency in the State of Florida; Emergency Order 20-91; the recent guidance from the CDC; the fact that the 2018-2020 biennial renewal for licensure ended March 31, 2020 but was extended to April 30, 2020 by Emergency Order of the Secretary of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation; and that many Real Estate professionals will be required to attend in-person continuing education courses/seminars to fulfill initial licensure or renewal

requirements, the FREC finds that an immediate danger to the public health, safety, or welfare necessitates immediate action regarding this issue. In addition, at the same meeting where this Emergency Rule was proposed, the Commission determined to initiate rulemaking to amend the Commission’s underlying rules in Chapter 61J2-3, Florida Administrative Code, to allow the live-streaming of approved in-person courses through December 31, 2020; after 1 January, 2021, the existing requirements for distance course approval will resume. Notice of this meeting was published in the Florida Administrative Register in Volume 46, No.102 on May 26, 2020 and again in Volume 46, No. 112 on June 9, 2020. In addition, notice of the FREC’s meeting was posted on the FREC’s official website.

SUMMARY: The proposed emergency rule authorizes Prelicensure, Post-Licensure, Reactivation, Continuing Education, and School Instructor education courses previously approved by the FREC to be delivered live and in-person to be delivered via live streaming / videoconferencing technologies for the ninety-day effective period of the emergency rule.

Providers may only utilize this process during the effective period of this rule, ninety (90) days from the effective date. In addition, each provider delivering education courses which require an end of course examination must make provision for the required end-of-course examination to be delivered through electronic methods that do not require a student’s physical presence.
